**These figures are based on 18 states submitting Praise Reports out of 25 active states. The numbers would be much higher if all states had submitted their Praise Reports in a timely fashion. Praise Reports are due by May 1<sup>st</sup> to the National Coordinator. Individual members are to have their reports to President or designated person by January 31<sup>st</sup>, unless your state by laws has a different date for a deadline.**



## COM MANUAL (INFO)

### CHAPTER 6 PG. 29,30

#### EFFECTIVE CHAPTER- COMMUNICATES OUTSIDE THE CHAPTER

Communicates outside the chapter.

The effective chapter maintains a strong line of communications with their state convention liaison. The closer this relationship, the better the chapter can function. Many chapters work closely enough with the state convention that they are included under the state conventions 501- C tax exempt status. Other chapters have their own chapter 501-C tax exempt status. Many state conventions provide financial and personnel support to the chapters and their functions. Some state convention liaisons are active members of the chapter.

**This section gets passed over, the benefits of having a good relationship with the state convention liaison. States that have strong connections with convention enjoy many benefits and helps. Such as being included in the states 501-C.**

The effective chapter maintains a strong line of communication with their COM regional representative. He is included in all chapter mailings including prayer requests, projects information, ministry opportunities, invitations to chapter rallies and social functions, updates of the roster, etc. The regional representative should be considered a member of each chapter in his region and included in the executive committee and business meetings. The chapter officers should consider the regional representative as support staff and request his assistance as needed.

**PRESIDENTS': Help our Regional Reps out!! Please add them to your membership mailings; Invite them to your Executive Meetings and business meetings. If they take the time to visit your state rallies and projects, welcome them as you would any other member of your chapter. If you have a liaison doing your chapter mailings, double check that your Regional Representative is receiving all communications. Please take this into consideration: Regional Reps not only are active in their own chapters, they have taken on more traveling to the states in their regions. They are self supporting, volunteer missionaries just like you. The Regional Representative is being a servant and an encourager to you and your chapter.**

The effective chapter maintains a frequent line of communications with the COM national coordinator. While the national coordinator's primary role is working with the regional representatives, his level of effectiveness is controlled by his level of understanding of the chapters needs. The chapters should send him copies of their newsletters, rosters, invitations to their chapter rallies, prayer requests, and information on projects and ministries needing volunteers. They also make sure the annual chapter praise report is submitted each year to the national coordinator.

**PRESIDENTS': Please add National Coordinator to all chapter emailings, just as you would a new member. Praise Reports are the responsibility of the President, unless it designated to another in your chapter. President should follow up with this person if he is not filling out the reports himself.**

The effective chapter makes sure that their chapter submits chapter news and information on mission projects and ministries needing COM support to the national newsletter editor each March, June, September and December. Individual members should be encouraged to submit interesting articles on members, chapter functions and accomplishments, proposed chapter events, and success stories. This is the time to give praise reports for all God has accomplished through your chapter. It is also a way to recognize your members. The chapter may choose to incorporate their chapter newsletter into the national newsletter.

**When all chapters or members send in news to the National Coordinator, or news of others and their accomplishments it encourages members of COM. Recognize your members, send in a note sharing what their accomplishments were. National Coordinator sends out notices when it is time for your chapter news.**

The effective chapter maintains a chapter website or maintains a chapter presence on the national COM website. The website can be an effective tool to share the COM with potential members and to share mission and ministry opportunities with the COMers in numerous chapters.

**If a chapter has a website; keep it updated, (phone numbers, emails, contact info, upcoming projects, rallies etc) Is it user friendly? Is it crisp and clean look,(be careful about too much stuff on home page, place information behind buttons, first impressions are important) If you do not have a website, consider putting one up. Check out other COM websites to see how they have set theirs up. They do not have to be expensive.**

**Social Media is how today's people find what they want, need, or yes even serving opportunities. We receive 2-3 communications a week from the National Website. They are wanting to know what we are about, and how they can get involved. There are times we do need to think outside the box. It is a way to reach the younger generation. We have a membership application on National, we have signed up several members for 5 different states. It does work, so give it a**
