


The Emblem of Campers on Mission embodies basic truths in which we believe and enables Campers on Mission to easily identify one another for Christian Fellowship "as we go".

## *What is New Mexico Campers on Mission?*

New Mexico Campers on Mission is the state chapter of a National Fellowship of Christian campers who share their faith while they camp. At least 30 states have chapters. A love of the outdoors and Christian fellowship and ministry characterize Campers on Mission. Whether backpackers hiking mountain trails, families on vacation or senior citizens motoring the highways, they find ways to tell others about their faith in Jesus Christ. They come in all ages and walks of life. Retired and active career individuals, young families, and grandparents all share in the ministry. From state fairs and public campgrounds to the back corner of church parking lots. Campers on Mission have found a way to combine a love of the outdoors with ministry. We take the heart of Christ out into the community to meet physical, emotional, social and spiritual needs of people. Meeting these critical needs results in the healing and redemption of people and contributes to the growth of the Kingdom of God

## *What Do Campers on Mission Do?*

Campers on Mission participate in short-term mission assignments all across the United States and Canada. These can be anything from building construction to Backyard Bible Clubs, projects at fairs, to outreach at campgrounds, parades and NASCAR races, Bible camp cleanups, fun training campouts, and our annual fall business meeting campout. Campers on Mission also reach out to others “as they go” on individual and family camping activities. The mission ideas are almost endless. NM-COM have State annual events plus other mission opportunities.

## *What Do I Need to Be a Camper on Mission?*

COM members just need to have a love for missions and to enjoy camping. This is much more important than how they camp. They camp with anything from a backpack and tent to an RV. No matter what kind of “gear” they have, any Christian can be an on-mission camper. Some of our members drive (or fly) to the rallies and mission sites and stay in a hotel. ## *How Can I Find Out About New Mexico Campers on Mission Events and Mission Opportunities?*

Events and mission opportunities are communicated to members by email. As an NM-COM member you can work at projects in other states.

## *Who Can Join Campers on Mission?*

Any adult (19 & over) that is a born-again Christian can be a Camper on Mission including their family. (A parent or legal guardian must always accompany children under 18.) Many missions opportunities can accommodate children and seniors. COM creates a pathway for becoming an on-mission family. It is a great way to introduce your children to missions! We look forward to seeing you at our events/missions projects.

## *How are Mission Requests Taken?*

Requests for projects may be sent to the President or Project Coordinator and must include pertinent information. This information will be posted within NM-COM and with the National COM coordinator. Some projects will be accepted as chapter projects and the others will be available to other chapters or individuals or church groups.
